2014-2020 Food for Life AmeriCorps Grant

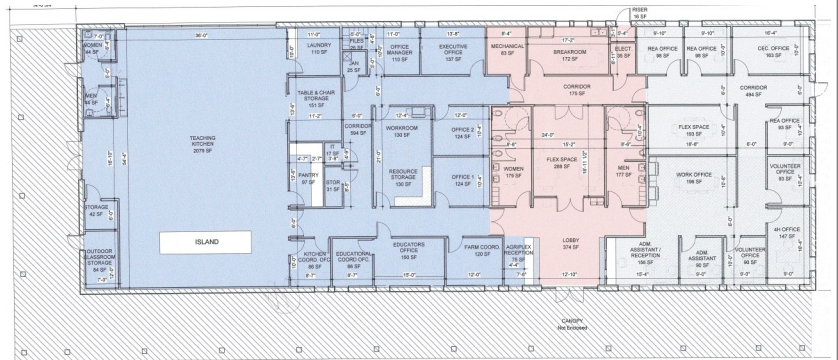
2020 Corner property purchased for expansion
